- Grants are awarded to assist federally recognized tribes in preserving and protecting their significant cultural and historic resources.
- Maximum grant award is \$60,000.
- Application deadline is generally in February or March.

Save America's Treasures

- Grants are awarded for preservation and/or conservation work on nationally significant intellectual and cultural artifacts and nationally significant historic structures and sites.
- Maximum grant award is \$700,000.
- Application deadline is generally in the spring.

- Grants are awarded to help preserve Alaska's endangered historic buildings and structures. The intent of the grant program is to provide assistance to owners of National Register of Historic Places properties to ensure the continued use and integrity of historic properties, stimulate economic development through heritage tourism, and increase public awareness and appreciation of Alaska's heritage.
- Maximum grant award is \$50,000.
- Availability of funding is uncertain in FY2007. Contact Joan Antonson, Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer, at (907) 269-8714 for more information.
