### **Early Actions**

- + Assessing current status of readiness of country for implementation (ie. data availability, assessing forest monitoring system)
  - + Develop appropriate methodologies, as applied under UNFCCC guidance. Developing appropriate strategies for REDD implementation
  - + Develop pilot activities (e.g. mechanism for distribution of benefits, testing local and national monitoring systems to learn from (i.e. for capacity building)). Show distribution of benefit at “reasonable scale” (e.g. district/province/island)
  - + Build capacity for all above and beyond. Explicit learning between countries. Explore regional institutions (e.g. ASEAN, APEC, ASEM, Asia Forest Partnership, etc.)
  - + Development of green gold standards (REDD as nexus between biodiversity, poverty alleviation and climate change)
- RED shouldn't be considered the only solution to deforestation. Needs to act in concert with other mechanisms (e.g. Lacey Act; PES)
