The Galápagos aboard the *Letty*

Multiple departures, 2009 & 2010

Visit seldom-toured islands by a small, privately chartered yacht. From \$4,695 **Ask us how to save up to \$500!**

Wild Alaska aboard the *Clipper Odyssey*

July 6 – 20

Cross the Arctic Circle and step ashore on Russian and American lands. Search for walrus, Arctic foxes, brown bears, whales and fur seals along the way. From \$9,980

Across the Far North aboard the *Clipper Adventurer*

Part I: July 13 – 29, part II: July 26 – August 10

On part I, cruise Spitsbergen to look for polar bears and visit Iceland's Grimsey Island. On part II, continue exploring Iceland, then voyage to Greenland. Voyages can be taken separately or combined. From \$9,480

Norway's Fjords and Arctic Svalbard aboard the *Explorer*

August 7 – 22
